

## **NOTICE TO ALL RESIDENTS OF THE CITY OF NAUVOO**

As of September 9, 2003 the Nauvoo City Council approved and passed Ordinance 2003-5 "Adopting City Wide Garbage Hauler". The Nauvoo City Council discussed this at meetings for well over a year and requested residents to fill out a survey on the possibility of doing this and received mostly positive comments. The major reason the Council decided to allow only one hauler in town, for residential pick up, is because of the savings it will create for the residents of Nauvoo. **Starting October 1, 2003** KohlMorgan Hauling out of Keokuk Iowa will provide weekly curb side garbage pickup, weekly curb side recycling and once a year a curb side City wide clean up. **The fee for residential service will be \$8.70 a month and will be billed on the water/sewer bills. Garbage pick up will be on Fridays and they ask that everyone has their garbage out by 7:30 a.m.** This will be a mandated service. All residents will be required to comply.

Residents are allowed 6 loose bags of garbage a week. Recyclables must either be in a transparent yellow bag (which you may purchase at City Hall for .10 cents a bag), or a clear or white garbage bag. Please place the recyclables next to the garbage for pick up. Yard waste, batteries, tires or wet paint cans will not be accepted.

The following is a list of Do's & Don'ts for Curbside Recycling:

### **Acceptable Items:**

- Newspaper** - Place loose in bottom of plastic sack.
- Clear Glass Food & Beverage Containers** - Throw away lids. Labels may stay on and please rinse them. Clear glass only is accepted.
- Plastics** - They only accept containers that have the recycling sign on it with the #1 or #2 inside the sign. Please remove the lids.
- Corrugated Cardboard** - Please Flatten Corrugated Boxes.
- Brown Paper Sacks** - Place any clean paper sacks in your recycling container.
- Aluminum & Tin Cans** - Please rinse clean and labels may stay on.
- Mixed Paper** - Cereal boxes, case pop cartons, etc. Flatten and remove plastic inside. Magazines, catalogs, old mail including window envelopes, and phone books. Clean paper, typing paper, computer printouts, etc.

### **Unacceptable Items:**

- Don't recycle pizza boxes contaminated with food or other paper items contaminated with food.**
- Don't tie or bind.**
- Don't recycle clean or dirty toilet paper or diapers.**
- Don't recycle Styrofoam.**
- Don't recycle any plastic toys.**
- Don't recycle holiday wrapping or bows.**
- Don't recycle clothes and other textiles.**
- Don't recycle containers that once had hazardous waste in them such as oil, gas, varnish, etc.**
- Don't put out yard waste, batteries, tires, or wet paint cans for pick up.**
